The purpose of the Project is to help the Government of Serbia improve the competitiveness of the Serbian economy, its macroeconomic position and private sector businesses. The BEP provides technical assistance, trainings, and other sorts of support to improve the business-friendly environment, macroeconomic stability and further develop financial markets. The Project is demand driven: all activities are based on the priorities of the private sector and the Government.

The Business Enabling Project's Component 1: Business Regulation and Economic Governance has a goal to streamline the laws and regulations, as well as the institutions, in order to improve regulators' capacity to implement regulations, regulatory analysis and public-private dialogue.
